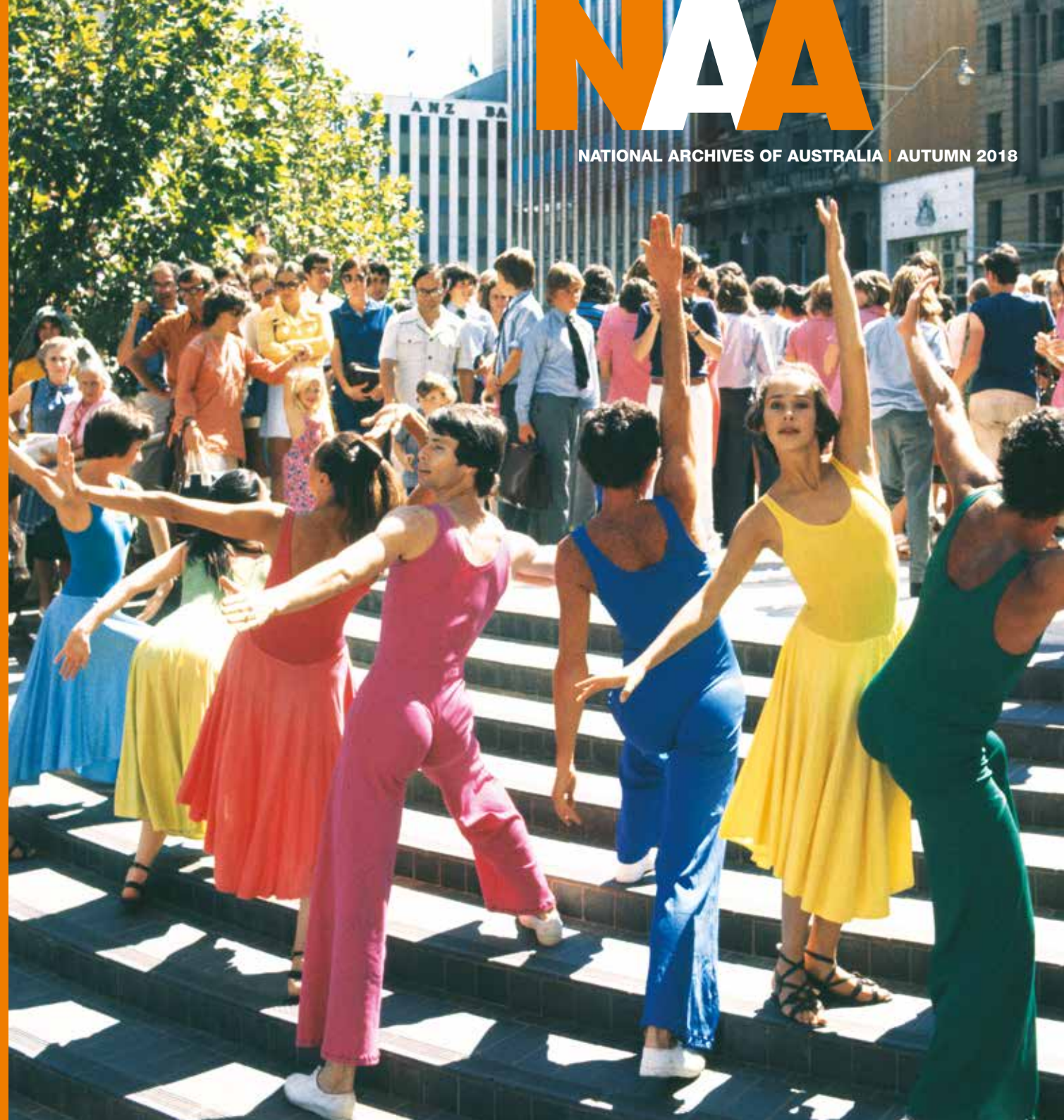

This supports conservation work to maintain the heritage-listed Old Parliament House building, in which we are a tenant.
