Commonwealth of Australia. ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS.

ORDER IN RELATION TO THE DEPARTMENTS OF SHIPPING AND FUEL AND SUPPLY AND DEVELOPMENT.

Ordered by His Excellency the Governor-General.

I WILLIAM JOHN McKELL, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, do hereby approve of the Administrative Arrangements specified in the Schedule hereto, and do order, until further Order herein, that all Acts of the Parliament of the Commonwealth relating to the matters specified in the second column of the Schedule hereto opposite to the name of a Department (including the Acts specified in the third column, opposite to the name of a Department) shall, unless the contrary intention appears in the Act, be administered by the Minister of State for the Commonwealth administering that Department.

#### THE SCHEDULE.

The names of the Departments of State of the Commonwealth are specified in the first column of the Schedule, and the matters dealt with by each Department and the Acts administered by the Minister administering it are respectively specified in the second and third columns opposite the name of the Department.
