ORDER BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL ORDER BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL I, RICHARD GARDINER, BARON CASEY, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council hereby approve that, in addition to the Acts of the Parliament of the Commonwealth specified in the third column of the Schedule to the Administrative Arrangements Order made on the sixteenth day of May, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-eight, in relation to the Prime Minister's Department, the Acts of the Parliament of the Commonwealth specified in the Schedule to this Order shall be administered by the Prime Minister.

Navigation Act 1912-1968 ORDER UNDER SECTION 7

EXEMPTION OF TRADE WITH CHRISTMAS ISLAND

By His Excellency the Governor-General in and over the Common-wealth of Australia.

WHEREAS by Section 7 of the Navigation Act 1912-1968 it is provided, inter alia, that a ship shall be deemed to be engaged in the coasting trade within the meaning of that Act, if she takes on board passengers or cargo at any port in a State, or a Territory under the authority of the Commonwealth, to be carried to, and landed or delivered at, any other port in the same State or Territory or in any other State or other such Territory:

And whereas by the second proviso to that section it is provided that the Governor-General may by order declare that the carrying of passengers or cargo between ports in any Territory under the authority of the Commonwealth, or between ports in any such Territory and any other Australian ports, or ports in any other such Territory shall not be deemed engaging in the coasting trade:

nerthery shall not be decided engaging in the costing trade: And whereas it is desirable that the carrying of passengers or cargo between Christmas Island, a Territory under the authority of the Commonwealth, and ports in Australia, or ports in any other such Territory, shall not, during the period during which this Order is in force be deemed engaging in the coasting trade:

Now therefore, I, Richard Gardiner, Baron Casey, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby declare that the carrying of passengers and cargo between Christmas Island and ports in Australia, or ports in any other Territory under the authority of the Commonwealth, shall not, during the period during which this Order is in force, be deemed engaging in the coasting trade: trade:

And I do further declare that this Order shall come into opera-tion on and from the date on which it is published in the Gazette, and shall remain in force until and including the thirty-first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and sixty-nine.
