ADMINISTRATIVE ARRANGEMENTS

ORDERED BY HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL

I, SIR PAUL MEERNA CAEDWALLA HASLUCK, the Governor-General in and over the Commonwealth of Australia, acting with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, hereby approve the following administrative arrangements:—

1. The matters dealt with by a Department of State specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order include the matters specified in the second column of that Schedule opposite to the name of that Department in the first column of that Schedule and other matters arising under the enactments administered by the Minister of State administering that Department.

2. The enactments administered by the Minister of State administering a Department of State specified in the first column of the Schedule to this Order are the enactments specified in the third column of that Schedule opposite to the name of that Department in the first column of that Schedule and any other enactment (whether passed before or after the date of this Order), not being an enactment specified in the third column of the Schedule to the Administrative Arrangements Order made on 19th December, 1972, or in the third column of the Schedule to this Order opposite to the name of any Department, that relates to a matter dealt with by that Department.

3. The administrative arrangements set out in the Administrative Arrangements Orders made on 19th December, 1972, and 20th December, 1972, respectively, continue in force, by virtue of this Order, except in relation to the Department of Secondary Industry, the Department of Supply and the Department of Transport.
